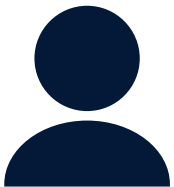

Even flat funding represents a reduction in services over time. Based on the Alaska Department of Labor's inflation calculator Homeless Services funding has experienced a **27%** reduction since 2009.
